Difference between an Exchange and Clinical Elective and an Independent Study

An Exchange elective is a clinical experience outside the US in which the AMS student is hosted by a foreign medical school and treated like a student of that school. Each exchange program has an MOU which delineates how many students can participate and any specific timeframe for them to rotate. There is an application process and a Brown faculty member who is identified as the liaison for the exchange. That faculty member completes the evaluations for the AMS students who participate. Once approved, AMS students would be registered under the course number for that particular exchange program.

An International Independent Study (IS) is when an AMS student is working with a Brown faculty member who sponsors them on a rotation or research project that takes place internationally. It may or may not be at an international medical school. Please see the <u>AMS Records and Registration site</u> for more details about the applying for international independent study.

Other Medical Electives taken internationally - such as the Kenya or Dominican Republic electives - are initially approved as electives by the Medical Curriculum Committee. Each of these electives has a Brown faculty member as course leader and a separate course number. These are clinical experiences that usually take place at one or two times a year at the course leader decision. Students register by emailing the course leader.

AMS Exchange Elective Application Process

- Contact faculty liaisons to discussion opportunity* may be email, phone or in person depending on the faculty but start with email please.
- Complete Application with Essay by September 29, 2023 by 5pm Send to Eileen Caffrey@brown.edu
- You may apply to up to 3 exchanges-you must RANK and on the same application form indicate your rationale for each program. You just inform the faculty of each program that you are applying for other programs and give your PREFERENCE. Preference may be given to those who indicate one clear exchange.
- Anyone who will attend ANY exchange program may indicate this by checking the appropriately labeled box and we will contact you after the first round of acceptances of what we have to offer you.
- Committee review and assign exchanges with notification mid-October At this time the faculty will sign all the forms required (they do NOT have to be signed in advance)
- ACCEPTANCE of SPOT by November 30, 2023 is "binding" as a professional courtesy to our exchange programs* you have up to 3 months prior to the elective to withdraw but must notify Eileen Caffrey Wright (Eileen Caffrey@brown.edu) and the appropriate faculty liaison with a clear explanation

AMS Exchange Elective Application Process After Acceptance

- Pre-travel orientation will vary for each site and will be initiated by site faculty liaison. The Global Health Initiative will be in contact at least 6 weeks before travel to discuss plans and university travel requirements. Please reach out with any questions. (<u>Eileen Caffrey@brown.edu</u>)
- Please familiarize yourself with the <u>International Travel Risk Management site</u> and review information, guidance and requirements.
- US Dept State issues <u>travel advisories</u> for each country that are updated as needed.
 - If your destination is considered high risk travel (Level 3), you must submit a Safety Plan (via TravelSafe) to the Global Travel Risk and Assessment Committee (GTRAC) no later than 8 weeks in advance of your planned travel for approval. As of August, 2023, China is the only Exchange Elective country that is listed as high risk (Level 3) by the US Dept of State.

Other International Elective Opportunities (Not part of exchange application process)

These longstanding electives are arranged separately and administered by the Dept. of Medicine. You need to contact the faculty directly for more information and application process.
